Conditions of accepting the semester:

- 1.) Active participation on lectures, based on the study and exam regulations of the University. If more than 25% of the lectures are not visited by the student, the semester can't be accepted.
- 2.) Late, absence: If a student comes more than 15 minutes late, it is regarded as an absence. If a student is late three times, it is equal with one missing.
- 3.) There'll be one midterm written exam, in the 12th week, which must be passed (grade 2). It may be corrected only once. The average of the failed first exam and the retake has to be at least 2,0 else the semester can't be accepted. If a student is missing from a written exam the participation on the retake is obligatory. If a student is missing from the retake the semester can't be evaluated.
- 4.) In the end of the semester there'll be an exam, for this exam there's a practical pre-exam which is about correct placement of rubber dam. If a student fails this pre-exam, the whole exam is considered as failed and next time the pre-exam must be repeated. If a student passes the pre-exam and fails the exam, the pre-exam doesn't have to be repeated again.
