Requirements for students:

- Active participation on lectures and practices, based on the Study and Exam Regulations of the University and the Faculty of Dentistry.
- Attendance of clinical sessions is mandatory.
- Completion of the tasks in the clinical sessions, average of grade should be at least 2.0.
- Keeping the *Rules of students' activity* in the Department of Prosthodontics, it can be read on Coospace.
- Pass midterm written examination. Unsatisfactory test should be corrected; it may be corrected only once!
- If the student is absent at the time of the MTO, it will be regarded as a failed mark.
- Apart from the midterm examination, if there are 4 failed marks (for oral test, small written test, error in administration, etc.) a written test must be taken (the topic is selected by the teacher). This test should be written independently of the midterm examination.
- There is only one opportunity to fulfill this test. If a student fails to pass or collects more failed marks, he/she will get a failed mark (1) at the end of the semester. It means that the course has to be repeated.

- The student is not allowed to take the precision impression from a patient until the patient's Protsthetic Sheet is not accepted and signed.
- Students must come to the session on time: If a student is late three times, it is equal with one missing. If a student comes more than 20 minutes late, it is regarded as an absence.

Midterm written examination:

Complete denture, crowns and bridges, dental materials (Dr. A. Stájer)

Date: middle of October.

Minimum clinical requirements:

- 1.) 1 fixed/removable partial denture, with metal framework, or 2 bridges,
- 2.) I post and core with crown and a bridge, or two more crowns

Practice evaluation:

- Average of MTO's
- Average of marks given for practical work
- Average mark for oral or small written tests
- Evaluation of Case presentation
- Evaluation of professionalism

Those students who get a mark 5 for case presentation in the first and second semester will not make partial denture design on the comprehensive exam in prosthodontics, that part of the exam will be evaluated as excellent (5).
